RULES AND REGULATIONS

1.—That the Society be known as "The Swaledale Agricultural and Horticultural Society," and that all the funds collected by the Committee be devoted entirely to the benefit of improving live stock, breeding and farm produce for the market generally, in the Society's District; and the Committee when elected will be expected to give their services free, and not to receive any remuneration for work done in the carrying out of the Society's duties.

2.—That the Prize Schedule be open to all, unless otherwise stated. District Classes confined to the parishes of Muker, Melbecks, Grinton, Reeth, Arkengarthdale and Marrick.

3.—That all Live Stock must be the *bona-fide* property of the Exhibitor three months previous to the Show, and all Dead Stock the property of the Exhibitor.

4.—The competition will take place at Muker on September 12th, and all entries must be given to the Secretary or Treasurer on or before September 1st, at which time the Entries will close, and nothing must be shown which is not in the Entry.

5.—Entries of Cattle and Sheep, 2/- for each entry. Dogs, Handicraft, Butter, Cheese and Eggs, 1/- each entry. Admission 2/- each (including tax). Children half price.

7.—All Entrance Money to be paid at the time of entering, and all letters must contain the Entrance Money and number of each Class they wish to enter.

8.—All Stock must be on the ground and penned before 10 o'clock in the morning, and no animal will be allowed to leave the ground before 4 p.m., except by permission from the Secretary.

9.—If any Exhibitor acts in any manner with intention to defraud the Society by securing unfairly any prize offered, or retaining any fees, the Society may debar such person or persons from exhibiting for three years.

10.—Bulls must be secured by the nose with a ring. No dogs to run at large in the field. All animals both before and after being judged must be taken to their respective stalls and kept there until the close of the Exhibition, or a fine of 10/- will be imposed in every case where an animal is found out of its proper place, without direct leave from the Committee.

11.—All Cattle and Sheep brought into the Show Ground for exhibition must have the Judges' number attached on the far side, before they can be exhibited, for the benefit of the public. These numbers will be given out at the Secretaries' Tent on the morning of the Show. If this is not carried out, no Prize Money will be paid.

12.—That all Prize Cards after being won be attached to all Cattle and Sheep, or else the Prize may be forfeited.

14.—All Special Prizes to be sent to the Secretary before the Show. Where there is only one entry in the Society's Prizes, the second prize only will be given, and the third prize will be omitted if there are not more than three entries.

15.—Subscribers are requested to pay their Subscriptions to any of the Committee in the District, or to the Secretaries or Treasurer, on or before the entries close.

16.—If any dispute arise respecting the age of any animal, the exact age shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Committee. The decision of the Judges shall be final, except where misrepresentation is discovered. Any objection must be made to the Secretary within 21 days of the Show; it must be in writing, and the objector must at the same time deposit of 10/- with the Secretary, which shall (if the objection be sustained) be returned with 10/- added by the Society, and if not sustained, the 10/- to go into the Society's Funds.

17.—No Prize Money to be paid until the last Saturday in September. The Society do not bind themselves to pay the money to the Cow Classes, etc., till proved in calf. In all cases the decision of the Committee shall be final and not subject to any Court of Law.

18.—Should it occur at any time that from unseen adverse circumstances the Society's Funds fall short of meeting existing liabilities to the successful competitors at the Annual Show after every expense necessarily incurred is disbursed, the claimants must be content to receive the balance *pro rata* amongst them as full discharge of all claims against the members of the Society.

19.—Winners of the Cups will be required to give a written guarantee that they will keep them in good condition and return them to the Secretary one month previous to the Show.

20.—Nothing to be shown in artificial colours, or prize cards from other Shows (except cards in Winners Parade), or they will be disqualified by the Judges.

21.—Should any dispute arise with any exhibit, the said exhibit will be totally in the hands of the Stewards in the ring.

22.—Implements, and Fruit and Sweet Stalls, will be admitted if duly entered, and upon the following fees being paid: Stands £1. Owners of stands and their assistants to be charged usual admission fee if above two.

23.—All Cups to be taken up by the winners on Show Day, or Prize Money withheld.

24.—The Society will make the best arrangements in their power for the accommodation and safety of the public, but will not be responsible for loss arising from accident or otherwise. Animals out of place will be liable for any damage they may do.

25.—No Stock Judge to attend two years in succession.

26.—No person to interfere with the Judging in the Ring, but the Stewards to see that all Stock is brought out for show.

27.—Any Exhibitor breaking the Rules shall forfeit any prize he may have won.

28.—All Exhibitors must reside in the Society's District before they can compete in the District Classes.
